LASALLIAN REFLECTION - The Dynamics of Lasallian Spirituality: The Holy Presence of God


The prayer that begins Lasallian activities provides a starting hope and a defining end: "Let us remember that we are in the Holy Presence of God." Some form of this prayer is used each day in Lasallian schools, communities, and ministries throughout the world. From the earliest times, this prayer "will help the teachers to recollect themselves and recall the presence of God; it will serve to accustom the students to think of God from time to time and to offer God all their actions, and to draw upon themselves God's blessing." In very few words, and with habitual frequency, it is a statement that invites intentional reflection, renewed awareness, and a change in perspective. The words are the setting of the jewel of that shared silence. This central Lasallian prayer and invocation encapsulates an essential dimension of our Lasallian identity, mission, community, and charism. It invites us to do what we say and to live what we believe.


Winter Concert


