We are dedicated to developing our students' spirituality, academic progress, physical abilities, and social and behavioral maturity.



OUR FOUNDER



De La Salle High School is named for Saint John Baptist de La Salle, the founder of the Brothers of the Christian Schools.

De La Salle was born April 30, 1651, in Rheims, France. As a young priest, he became aware of the plight of the young boys of his era. With the first Brothers, he established the Christian Schools.

These early schools were centered on attentiveness to the needs of young people. They were open to all and were known for creative systems, which called schools to function well. The teachers in the Christian Schools saw themselves as Ministers of Grace, while the school and all in it were to announce the Good News of God's unconditional love.

Be La falle

De La Salle died in 1719, leaving a congregation of religious teaching Brothers and bequeathing an extraordinary educational tradition to the world. Pope Leo XIII proclaimed John Baptist de La Salle a saint of the Roman Catholic Church on May 24, 1900. In 1950, Pope Pius XII named St. John Baptist de La Salle as patron saint of all teachers.

Today, the Brothers of the Christian Schools and their Lasallian partners teach over 1,240,879 students in some 1,100 schools in 78 countries. In the United States, there are nearly 426 Christian Brothers. They conduct 147 schools, including elementary and secondary schools, colleges, technical schools, and child care centers.

OUR HISTORY






In 1939, permission was granted by the Archdiocese of New Orleans to Christian Brothers Provincial, Brother Arsenius, FSC, to organize a fund drive to construct a new school in New Orleans. That school would go on to become De La Salle High School.

De La Salle Catholic Boys' High School opened its doors on September 6, 1949, with a freshman class of 58 boys. In 1953, the school received approval from the State Board of Education and graduated its first senior class. Throughout the years, De La Salle has evolved while ever maintaining its mission of educating the youth of our community in the Lasallian tradition.

On August 21, 1992, De La Salle opened its doors to girls, officially becoming the first coeducational Catholic high school in New Orleans.

Today, the tradition continues! De La Salle continues to guide and prepare young men and women to become outstanding citizens of our community.





FORMATION

In addition to school Masses and a schoolwide Day of Reconciliation, campus ministry also supports grade level retreats and a variety of other formation activities. Students can grow further in their faith through a variety of service opportunities, praying the Rosary with fellow students and faculty, and reflections in our chapel.







GRADE LEVEL RETREATS

8th Grade - Five Core Principles

Students attend a daylong retreat as an entire class. Under the leadership of junior and senior Retreat Team members, our 8th graders explore the Five Core Principles of Lasallian Education in specific, practical ways that can be lived out authentically in our school community.

9th Grade - Personal Reflection

Students explore their gifts, the ways they can serve and encourage their peers, and the means by which they can accept support from their classmates through a ropes course. The day concludes with a time for students to create a spiritual profile reflecting on who they are as children of God and who they hope to become over these next four years of high school. The retreat experience culminates with a teaching Mass for the entire class.

10th Grade - Prayer Breakfast/Day of Service

Students participate in two formation activities. In the fall semester, students attend a breakfast and prayer service with their mothers to reflect upon and appreciate that relationship. In the spring semester, students directly serve at various nonprofits throughout the city.

1 1th Grade - Relationship with God

Students participate in a twilight retreat with a select group of other juniors. The evening provides time for reflection on their relationships with their classmates, their families, and themselves, and exploration of how those relationships reflect God's will in their lives, particularly in overcoming obstacles.

12th Grade - Senior Promises and Beyond

Students explore the Senior Promises, how they can lead the student body in living out the Five Core Principles over the course of their senior year, and how they can continue to be inspired by and demonstrate those principles as they prepare for the next stage of their lives.



TUESDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2024 OPEN HOUSE

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2024

Applicants attending a Catholic elementary school should return the completed Archdiocesan application to the Catholic elementary school principal. Catholic elementary schools will only send transcripts to De La Salle from the applicant's current school.

DECEMBER/JANUARY

All 8th and 9th grade applicants, accompanied by a parent/guardian, must take part in an interview during this time. The interview lasts approximately 30 minutes. Each interview will be scheduled on an individual basis. The De La Salle Admissions Office will contact the applicant to schedule his or her interview. Applicants should wear their school uniform.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2025

Decision letters are mailed to the address on file. If an applicant does not receive a letter by Friday, March 1, he or she should contact the admissions office at admissions@delasallenola.com.



WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 2024

If applicant attends a Catholic elementary school, the Archdiocesan application will be given to students at his or her school.

If applicant attends a non-Catholic elementary school, the application will be available at www.arch-no.org on this date.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2024

All applicants are required to submit both an Archdiocesan application and a De La Salle application.

If applying to 8th or 9th grade for the first time, applicants must also submit the \$75 one-time, non-refundable, non-transferable application and testing fee, as well as all required documents (see checklist) directly to De La Salle.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 11, 2025 ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT DAY

All 8th and 9th grade applicants to De La Salle are required to attend Academic Assessment Day at De La Salle High School from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

SUMMER 2025 FOUNDATIONS SUMMER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Incoming 8th and 9th grade students attend a two-week mandatory enrichment program during the month of June before beginning their De La Salle careers. Financial information for the Summer Foundations program is listed on our school website.
