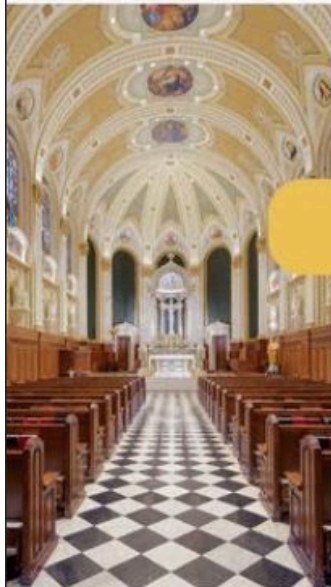

Homecoming Dance Guidelines

- The Homecoming Dance is at The Cannery located at 3803 Toulouse St., N.O., La. 70119 from 8:00 to 11:00 p.m on November 8th. The lock-in portion of this event is from 8:30 to 10:30 p.m. Students must arrive by 8:30 p.m., and cannot leave until 10:30 p.m. Students should be picked up or otherwise leave the venue by 11:00 p.m.
- Tickets cost \$50 each and must be purchased at school ahead of time. Tickets will be on sale during lunch beginning on Monday, November 3rd and continuing through Friday, November 7th. Tickets will NOT be sold at the dance! Cash and credit/debit cards are accepted.
- Students and guests will not be allowed entry without a ticket signed by their parents.
- Students may invite a guest of the opposite gender to Homecoming. Please keep in mind the following:
 - Guests may be students from another grade level at De La Salle.
 - Guests may be De La Salle students who are graduates of the class of 2024 or 2025.
 - Guests may be from another school, but should be under the age of 21.
 - Guests are subject to all De La Salle standards, including grooming and dress rules (fully explained below) and behavior expectations.
 - Guests may not be former De La Salle students, unless there is express written permission from the principal. (Students who graduated from De La Salle in 2024 or 2025 are permitted to attend without signed permission from the principal.)
 - Please note that we will reserve the right to deny entry or issue discipline consequences to De La Salle students based on disregard for De La Salle standards by their guests. De La Salle students are responsible for their guests' adherence to De La Salle guidelines.
- All De La Salle grooming and hair rules are in place. Specifically note the following:
 - Sunglasses are not permitted inside the building.
 - Boys must be clean shaven. Hair must not extend to the top of the collar in the back or middle of the forehead in the front, and sideburns may not extend below one-half of the ear. If the hairstyles do not extend to the collar, they may be no more than 2" from the scalp. Boys are not allowed to dye, highlight, or braid their hair. Extreme hairstyles or hairstyles with designs are unacceptable.
 - For girls, highlights consistent with a natural appearance are acceptable. Any hair coloring must appear to be natural or naturally highlighted. Black hair dye is not allowed. Extreme hairstyles or hairstyles with designs are unacceptable. Two-tone hair (example: ombre) is unacceptable. Girls' bangs must not cover their eyes. Any abrupt change in hair color must be avoided. Excessively long hair may be deemed inappropriate by the Dean of Students. Extremes in the length of hair are not

allowed. Hair should not be longer than the top of a student's skirt (or the waist).

- No visible tattoos

- Homecoming is a formal occasion with the following dress expectations:

- For young men:

- Coat and traditional tie (sport coat and dress pants or suit) are to be worn.
- Dress shoes and socks must be worn.
- No hats, bandanas, or headwear of any kind are allowed inside. Bandanas and head wraps are never allowed.
- No pierced body parts or tattoos are to be visible.

- For young ladies:

- Dresses must be formal. Dresses for Homecoming must be floor length, reaching to at least the ankle. Young ladies may wear dressy pants suits, with the approval of the Dean of Students, to Homecoming.

- If the dress has a slit, it should not be open more than 2" above the knee.

- The following are not allowed: immodest bare-backs (backs should not be bare below the shoulder blade), low necklines (dresses should not reveal cleavage; nor should there be low necklines), visible midriffs, cutouts

- Dress shoes should be worn; no casual sandals, tennis shoes, boots or slippers.

- No pierced body parts are to be visible except the ear lobes.

- If a shawl or sweater is worn to ensure the dress is fully in compliance, the student is expected to wear it for the entire event.

- De La Salle discourages students arriving to or leaving from school dances in limousines. Students may not arrive or leave in a "party bus."
